

Waste Management had not been notified 24 hours in advance of this extra load and did not pick it up when it collected the other trash.

Fortunately the carpet installing company came to the co-owner's rescue and sent a truck back to pick up the old carpeting and padding so the co-owner did not have to haul all of that mess back into her garage for the following week's pickup.

There is a new addition to Meadow Lake. It is an A-frame message board. It will be placed in front of the complex and be used to announce news pertinent to all co-owners. You probably have already seen it as we used it to remind folk when spider spraying began and again to announce the change in trash day after the Memorial Day Holiday. Future uses could include annual and special meeting announcements, or major work being done within the complex.

PARKING LOT PAINTING

The lines in our parking lots will be painted in early June. Watch for a message on the message board as to which parking lots will be painted on a particular day. Terry Entwistle will be heading this up aided by



volunteers John C., Tracy M. and Al G. who have offered to paint. Probably two or three lots will be done a day, depending on difficulties encountered. Once this is done, hopefully our guest and unit spaces will be more easily seen.

Of course, on the day that we paint your parking lot it will be better if all cars are removed from the lot, and either parked in the street or in a garage.

OTHER VEHICLE MATTERS

This is a good time to remind people that according to the by-laws they should have received when purchasing their unit, each unit is allowed two parking spaces. One of these is in your garage. The other is the one directly behind your garage that is

labeled with the letter of your unit (A, B, C, or D). Guest spaces are for guests. . (Continued on p 2) Since this has not been addressed for a while, we remind co-owners and their guests to park in the designated areas as assigned. Please use the guest spaces for guests. If you have company over, and they exceed the guest spaces, please have them park in the street. Thank you for your cooperation.

HAVE FUN, BUT...

PLEASE be a good neighbor. If you are entertaining, please keep the noise down, especially after 11 o'clock at night. Loud talking, yelling, the bass from loud stereo systems, whether in your unit or in a vehicle outside, can be heard in adjoining units as well as units across the street from you.

Residents who find a neighbor's party after hours becoming too rowdy, BUT do not feel comfortable with confronting the neighbor, are welcome to call the Macomb County Sheriff Dispatcher. This is the same procedure they would follow in any neighborhood, whether it is a multiple as we are, or a neighborhood of private homes. The caller does not need to give a name or address, just the address of the offending home. The sheriff's officer will do a drive by and if it is agreed that the noise is excessive, they will confront the offending party.


