SNOW REMOVAL

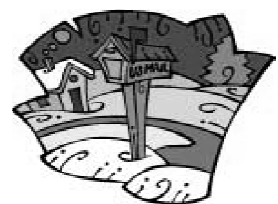
We had our first minor snowfall last night (November 25) so that "white stuff" is on the way. Following are some guidelines that our snow removal services follow:

1. The snow removal crew comes early to plow the street first.
2. Once this is done, the parking lots come next. If you park in the parking lot, it is advised that you move your vehicle to the street temporarily as soon as the streets are plowed.
3. After the lots are plowed, sidewalks and porches are cleared.
4. This procedure may be repeated, should we have a very heavy snow.

Patience is needed especially if we are not the first ones to be plowed out. Be aware if you have a car parked outside, that you may want to move your car as soon as you sense that the streets are done. No one, including the snow crew wants to have a car plowed in. If in doubt, ask a member of the crew, or if you see your neighbors moving their cars, get ready to move yours as well once the streets are done.

Remember that sidewalks and porches are the last to be plowed and yes it is time to bring your doormats in so wayward mats do not damage the snow removal equipment.

GARAGE DOORS

Remember to keep your garage doors closed during the winter months. It will keep your own unit warmer not to mention and carriage house upstairs (Unit D). They especially suffer the drop in temperatures if your garage doors are not kept shut. Please be considerate of your neighbors and remember to follow this practice and don't make them have to ask you to do this.

Tis the time for grinches to come and steal, whatever they can find. Leaving the garage door open for too long can be an invitation for that as well. It is wise if you park outside NOT to leave your garage door remote in too accessible a place, especially at night.
